Omoksee Returns for a Triple Event This Year! Saturday, June 15th

We've had many new members this year, so maybe it's time to recap just what Omoksee's are all about. The word originates from the Native American word for "riding with a purpose," Omoksee combines speed, skill, and precision in a thrilling display of horsemanship.

For those unfamiliar, an Omoksee is a timed event where horse and rider navigate through a series of challenging obstacles, showcasing their agility, control, and bond. Our Omoksee's are three main events – Baton Relay, Ball Toss and Poles. There are two "mystery" events from barrel racing to barrel weaving or maybe something of a surprise thrown in. The day rounds out with each rider having entered 5 events and two runs per event – fastest time counts.

The decision to bring back Omoksee comes as no surprise as our members have so much fun and it's our biggest arena turn out each year as it captures the hearts of riders from ages 13 to 80.

But in all honesty, we are a riding club having fun on all our own personal levels while enjoying the sense of camaraderie and community it fosters among the members.
