Join us on Saturday, May 10th for a saddle fitting clinic by Lacey Halstead of Whole Horse Saddle Fit. Lacey is a certified fitter not a saddle sales representative. She has many hours of classroom and hands-on learning. Lacey not only looks at the saddle to horse fit, she evaluates the overall movement of the horse and the rider.

The clinic will last about 1 ½ hours. During this time, Lacey will evaluate the saddle fit on 2-3 horses of different breeds. I'll need volunteer horses. She will also explain how to evaluate a saddle for seat size, width, straightness, etc. You are welcome to bring a saddle for this part of the program. She obviously can not evaluate everyone's saddle. After the clinic, Lacey will be available for a saddle fitting session with you and your horse for an additional fee of \$120. You must sign up before the clinic for a personal saddle fitting session. You pay Lacey directly for this. Please see her website for the details of a saddle fitting session. She did a great job with Deuce and me earlier this year!





three non-riding members: Karie, Bob and Judie at the Erway Farm for dealing of final cards and lunch. Winner of the Best Hand was Julie Heinsman with




Bob Crowl coming in a close 2nd. Prizes went to the winners and keychains and chocolate went to all participants.



Oat Cookies (Horse Treats)

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup flour
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 cup oil
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup uncooked oatmeal
- 1 1/2 cups shredded carrots

Instructions

- 1) Preheat the oven to 350F.
- 2) Mix all ingredients well.
- 3) Roll dough into 1 inch balls.
- 4) Bake for about 15 minutes.
- 5) Leave to cool completely.

Let your babies enjoy!

Note: You can substitute vegetable oil for olive oil. You can add almost anything to these, such as, peppermints. Don't use brown sugar, as it contains molasses.
