

So again, what happens next?

As I see it, we have the following three options:

- 1) Dissolve the club per the by-laws.
- 2) A president comes forward and has

Unless we have volunteers by the end of November, we will have a vote at our General Meeting to dissolve the Club. In my opinion, if you vote "No" to dissolution, you are volunteering to serve on the committee. The current Executive Committee is not staying in place for next year. There are no guidelines in the by-laws about moving forward without an Executive Committee. I don't know how that can happen.

The Executive Committee is open to any other options you may have.

This ride is also on a Saturday and will be held on November 22nd.




CHAPS Mountain Trail Challenge Recap

ride before heading back to their trailer to take care of their bites.



After the FUN classes, all of the contestants came back to the arena with their







Recipe Roundup

Apple Carrot Horse Treats

Ingredients

- 1 cup chopped apples (remove seeds)
- 1 cup grated carrots
- 1 cup oats
- 1 cup flour (whole wheat or oats)
- 1/2 cup molasses

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix all the ingredients until well combined.
- 3. Roll the mixture into small balls or flatten it and cut into shapes.
- 4. Place on a baking sheet and bake for 30 minutes, or until golden brown.

Cool before serving to your horse.
